## IIJA Funded Projects

### I-10 Mobile River Bridge Replacement and Bayway Multimodal Project:

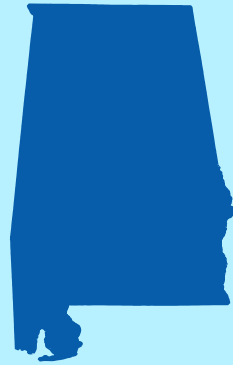
The \$550 million award will replace the I-10 Mobile River Bridge, improving safety, reliability, and mobility for the community.

### Railroad Crossing Elimination on Shelby County Road 52:

The \$42 million award will eliminate two at-grade crossings on Shelby County Road 52 (CR 52) with a new overpass over CSX's rail line, resulting in the closure of two crossings and road improvements on CR 52 near U.S. 31 to improve safety.

### Pine Barren Watershed:

This \$19 million award will reduce the impact of flooding in the area, resulting in improved community resilience and protection against future flood events.
