# COLORADO INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



## IIJA Funded Projects

### Arkansas Valley Conduit:

This \$250 million award will construct a 230-mile water pipeline from Pueblo to deliver clean drinking water to 50,000 people across Southeastern Colorado, resulting in improved water access and reliability for communities long awaiting this project.

### I-70 Floyd Hill Safety Improvements:

This \$100 million award will improve the I-70 Mountain Corridor by reducing collisions between vehicles and wildlife, easing traffic congestion, and preventing rockslides, resulting in safer travel and enhanced reliability for drivers.

### Leadville Mine Water Treatment Plant Replacement:

This \$56 million award will replace the Leadville Mine Drainage Tunnel and Treatment Plant to remove heavy metals from contaminated water, resulting in clean water access and improved public health for the community.
