CONNECTICUT INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Connecticut River Bridge Replacement:

This \$827 million award will replace the existing Connecticut River Bridge between Old Saybrook and Old Lyme with a modern, resilient moveable bridge, resulting in improved reliability and safety for rail passengers along the Northeast Corridor.

Gold Star Memorial Bridge Rehabilitation:

This \$158 million award will rehabilitate the Gold Star Memorial Bridge on I-95, resulting in improved safety, reliability, and connectivity between New York and New England.

Connecticut Department of Transportation Low and No Emission Bus Award:

This \$39 million award will purchase battery-electric buses and install charging infrastructure, resulting in reduced greenhouse gas emissions, improved air quality, and progress toward CTDOT's goal of a zero-emission fleet by 2027.
