GEORGIA INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Savannah Harbor:

This \$48 million award will fully fund environmental monitoring for two years during construction and ten years post-construction, resulting in long-term oversight and protection of the harbor's ecosystem.

Reimagine North Avenue:

This \$25 million award will make complete street improvements along North Avenue, resulting in upgraded bus stops with sidewalks and transit accommodations, pedestrian signals and lighting for safety, resurfaced roads with drainage improvements, and a shared-use path to provide residents—particularly those in low-income communities—with improved access to affordable multimodal transportation options.

Radium Springs Watershed:

This \$13 million award will reduce the impact of flooding through watershed improvements, resulting in enhanced resilience and protection for the Radium Springs area.
