HAWAII INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Waiale Road Extension:

This \$25 million award will construct the Waiale Road Extension to connect Waiale Road southward to Honoapiilani Highway, resulting in improved connectivity and transportation access in the region.

Poipu Road Safety and Mobility:

This \$24.8 million award will improve approximately 3.3 miles of Poipu Road from Koloa Town to the Poipu resort district, resulting in enhanced safety and mobility through the addition of three roundabouts, bicycle lanes, sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, bus stops, landscaped medians, resurfaced roadway, and drainage improvements for school children, commuters, and visitors.

Kapalama Container Terminal Project:

This \$47 million award will upgrade electrified ship-to-shore cranes, install solar panels on terminal buildings, and integrate smart gate and security technology, resulting in improved reliability, safety, and operational efficiency. The project will also add a new electrical micro-grid for resilience and develop a Facility Resiliency Plan and Terminal Electrification strategy in collaboration with local stakeholders.
