IDAHO INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Dworshak Dam and Reservoir:

This \$17 million award will fund a fish hatchery, electrical upgrades, and road restoration, resulting in improved ecological sustainability, infrastructure reliability, and access around the reservoir.

North Portneuf Crossing:

This \$7.8 million award will make traffic safety improvements at the intersection of North Kraft Road and North Main Extension, resulting in safer travel and increased active transportation through added non-motorized paths, crosswalks, and enhanced medians, as well as improved connections to recreational facilities and real-time monitoring technology for freight priority.

North Portneuf Crossing:

This \$7.8 million award will make traffic safety improvements at the intersection of North Kraft Road and North Main Extension, resulting in safer travel and increased active transportation through added non-motorized paths, crosswalks, and enhanced medians, as well as improved connections to recreational facilities and deployment of real-time monitoring technology for freight priority.
