KANSAS INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

18th Street Bridge Replacement Project:

This \$63 million award will replace a major river crossing built in 1959, resulting in a cost-effective solution that avoids expensive repairs and provides accommodations for active transportation, improving safety and connectivity in Kansas City.

South Kansas & Oklahoma Railroad Track Improvements:

This \$31.2 million award will improve approximately 37 miles of track on the Neodesha Subdivision of the South Kansas & Oklahoma Railroad, resulting in enhanced operations and increased rail capacity.

City of Salina Bridge Replacements:

This \$22 million award will replace seven bridges in Salina, Kansas, resulting in improved connectivity and safety, along with new parks and bike and pedestrian trails to enhance community recreation and mobility.
