LOUISIANA INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Port of New Orleans Container Terminal:

This \$300 million award will construct a new container terminal on the Gulf Coast, resulting in an alternative to inland terminals and the ability to accommodate larger vessels, strengthening regional trade capacity.

Calcasieu I-10 River Bridge Replacement:

This \$150 million award will replace the 70-year-old Calcasieu River Bridge and reconstruct the I-10/I-210 mainline within the project area, resulting in relief of a national freight bottleneck and improved regional mobility.

Flood Resiliency Improvements:

This \$148 million award will elevate 753 homes above floodwaters, buy out homes in repeated flood zones, and support community-wide projects, resulting in improved resilience for homeowners and communities through FEMA's Flood Mitigation Assistance program.
