MAINE INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

New Maine Highway Construction:

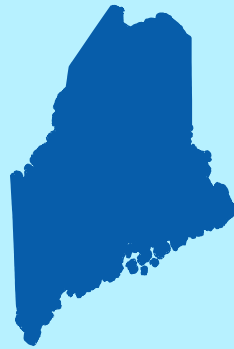
This \$77 million award will construct a highway connecting US Route 1 to the current bypass section, resulting in decreased traffic congestion and improved safety for travelers.

Downtown Sanford Transportation Improvements:

This \$25 million award will upgrade sidewalks and crosswalks to be ADA-compliant and install traffic calming measures, resulting in improved walkability, bike-ability, and more affordable transportation options for the community.

US 1 Rehabilitation:

This \$33 million award will rehabilitate approximately 68 miles of US 1 in Washington County by widening shoulders, replacing drainage, making safety improvements, and preparing for electric vehicle chargers, resulting in a safer and more resilient corridor ready for future transportation needs.
