## IIJA Funded Projects

### Frederick Douglass Tunnel Replacement:

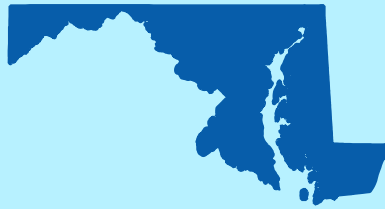
This award from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law will replace the 150-year-old Baltimore and Potomac Tunnel, one of the largest rail bottlenecks on the Northeast Corridor, resulting in improved reliability, safety, and commute times while generating 30,000 jobs.

### Baltimore County Offshore Wind Manufacturing Hub:

This \$47 million award will fund berth and upland improvements near the Port of Baltimore, including construction of roll-on/roll-off and crane pads, ground and geotechnical work, and steel structures to support offshore wind components, resulting in increased capacity for heavy cargo, site remediation, and environmental mitigation to advance clean energy infrastructure.

### Susquehanna River Rail Bridge Replacement Program:

This \$2.08 billion award will replace the aging two-track moveable bridge with two new fixed bridges totaling four tracks over the Susquehanna River, resulting in improved capacity, trip times, and safety for commuter, freight, and intercity passenger rail services, as well as enhanced navigation for marine users.
