# MISSISSIPPI INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



## IIJA Funded Projects

### Amtrak Gulf Coast Region Improvements:

This \$178 million award will upgrade tracks, signals, grade crossings, and stations along a key Gulf Coast rail corridor, resulting in improved safety, reliability, and passenger experience.

### I-10 Widening in Harrison and Hancock:

This \$60 million award will widen I-10 in Harrison and Hancock Counties, resulting in improved efficiency and capacity along a major freight corridor of regional significance.

### Mississippi Barrier Islands Restoration:

This \$77 million award will restore the Mississippi barrier islands, resulting in increased storm resilience, reduced saltwater intrusion and shoreline erosion, and strengthened tourism opportunities.
