MISSOURI INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Upper Mississippi River System Investments:

This \$829 million award will build a new 1,200-foot lock and modernize existing locks and dams along the Upper Mississippi River System, resulting in stronger supply chains and improved movement of critical goods like grain.

Improve I-70 Program:

This \$92 million award will reconstruct 191 miles of I-70 across Missouri, resulting in enhanced safety and efficiency through new truck parking facilities, ITS upgrades, wildlife crossings, pollinator habitat conservation, and added features like broadband infrastructure, solar panels, and smart work zone systems, while supporting workforce programs for disadvantaged communities.

Excelsior Springs Capital Improvements:

This \$21 million award will rebuild approximately 2 miles of streets with new curbs, gutters, and storm drainage, resulting in improved infrastructure and added sidewalks and trails along US 69 to enhance connectivity and active transportation options.
