MONTANA INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Rocky Boy's / North Central Montana Rural Water System:


This \$146 million award will build over 750 miles of pipeline and storage facilities to deliver clean, reliable water from the Tiber Reservoir, resulting in safe drinking water for more than 10,000 households and 28,000 residents, including the Chippewa-Cree Tribe and six adjacent counties in north-central Montana.

I-90 Modernization:

This \$66 million award will replace and rehabilitate aging infrastructure on I-90 between the Idaho-Montana state border and Alberton, resulting in improved safety, reliability, and long-term durability along this critical interstate corridor.

Missoula Urban Transportation District:

This \$39 million award will fund a new Maintenance, Operations, and Administration Base (MOAB) facility to replace the outdated site supporting Mountain Line bus service, resulting in expanded service to underserved neighborhoods, meeting future demand, and enabling a transition to a 100% zero-emissions fleet.



As of January 2025,
\$6.8 billion
has been distributed across Montana from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, funding
1,015 projects.
