NEBRASKA INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Missouri River Basin Levee Repairs:

This \$67 million award will repair levees damaged by flooding in the Missouri River Basin, resulting in restored flood protection and improved resilience for communities in northeastern Nebraska and southeastern South Dakota.

Lincoln Multimodal Transit Center:

This \$23.6 million award will construct a new sustainable transit center with bus bays, protected passenger boarding areas, and covered walkways, resulting in improved safety, security, and convenience for passengers and pedestrians.

Levee Repairs:

This \$67 million award will repair levees damaged by Missouri River Basin flooding, resulting in restored flood protection and improved resilience for affected communities.



As of January 2025,
