NEW JERSEY INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Hudson River Tunnel:

This \$3.8 billion award will rehabilitate and expand the 100-year-old Hudson River Tunnel between New York and New Jersey, resulting in improved reliability for the 200,000 daily passengers and addressing damage caused by Superstorm Sandy.

Port Newark:

This \$32 million award will reconstruct Berth PN-308, resulting in a new structure with a 75-year service life, increased load capacity, and enhanced resiliency features.

Union City Bus Garage Renovation:

This \$47 million award will renovate New Jersey Transit's Union City bus garage, resulting in a new public bus terminal, space for administrative services, and the ability to charge and deploy battery electric buses.
