NEW YORK INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Hudson River Tunnel:

This \$3.8 billion award will rehabilitate and expand the 100-year-old Hudson River Tunnel between New York and New Jersey, resulting in improved reliability for the 200,000 daily passengers and addressing damage caused by Superstorm Sandy.

I-81 Connecting Syracuse Project:

This \$180 million award will reconnect residents of Syracuse with a community grid that disperses traffic among neighborhood streets, resulting in improved access to economic opportunities and enhanced active transportation through sidewalks, bike paths, shared-use paths, and revitalized parks and public spaces.

Hunts Point Terminal Produce Market:

This \$110 million award will redevelop one of the nation's largest food distribution centers, resulting in an intermodal facility with expanded refrigerated warehouse space, EV charging stations for trucks and cars, and improved circulation and efficiency.
