IIJA Funded Projects

Interstate 5 Bridge Replacement Program:

This \$2 billion award will replace the I-5 bridge over the Columbia River connecting Vancouver, WA, and Portland, OR, resulting in a more resilient structure that addresses seismic risks, corrects structural weaknesses, and reduces congestion.

McNary Lock and Dam:

This \$22.7 million award will upgrade the McNary Lock and Dam by replacing downstream gate gudgeon anchors, spillway hoists and gates, installing a second derrick crane, and upgrading Hood Park's septic system—resulting in improved reliability and operational efficiency.

Tillamook Bay & Bar Project:

This \$62 million award will repair the south jetty at the Port of Garibaldi, resulting in improved safety for fishermen and expanded economic opportunities for the city.
