# TEXAS INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



## IIJA Funded Projects

### Bus Rapid Transit Corridor:

This \$150 million award will develop a Bus Rapid Transit corridor connecting Westchase Park-and-Ride to the Tidwell Transit Center, expanding high-capacity transit options and improving regional mobility.

### Flood Resilience Improvements:

This \$50 million award will protect a major wastewater treatment plant and a power plant in Austin, TX, from worsening flood risks, ensuring critical services remain online during severe weather events.

### Anzaldúas Bridge Expansion Project:

This \$25 million award will build commercial inspection facilities at the Anzaldúas Land Port of Entry, adding booths, docks, equipment, roadway, parking, and sidewalks. The project will upgrade southbound facilities and construct northbound facilities, improving safety, efficiency, and travel time reliability while enhancing economic competitiveness for cross-border freight.
