VERMONT INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Highgate Springs Port Expansion:

This \$150 million award will expand the existing port of entry in Highgate Springs on the Canadian border, improving capacity and efficiency for cross-border travel and trade.

Winooski River Bridge:

This \$24.8 million award will replace the Winooski River Bridge carrying US Routes 2 and 7 between Winooski and Burlington, improving safety and connectivity for travelers in Vermont.

Vermont Agency of Transportation:

This \$22 million award will purchase electric buses and charging equipment to replace aging diesel buses for Green Mountain Transit in Burlington, advancing Vermont's transition to a zero-emission transit fleet by 2050.
