IIJA Funded Projects

Multimodal Bridge over the Potomac River:


This \$20 million award will help create a 2,300-foot bicycle-pedestrian bridge connecting Long Bridge Park in Arlington, VA, to East and West Potomac Parks in Washington, DC, expanding safe, sustainable travel options across the river.

Transforming Rail in Virginia, Phase 2:

This \$729 million award will expand capacity, alleviate bottlenecks, and improve reliability along 12 miles of rail between Washington, DC, and Richmond, VA, including construction of the new Long Bridge over the Potomac River to enhance passenger and freight movement.

City of Norfolk Coastal Storm Risk Management:

This \$399 million award will build flood protection measures in Norfolk, including storm surge barriers, pump stations, floodwalls, levees, tide gates, property elevation, and natural features like oyster reefs and living shorelines, reducing coastal flooding risks and enhancing resilience.
