IIJA Funded Projects

Port of Tacoma:


This \$54 million award will fund improvements and reconfigurations at the terminal yard, enhancing operational efficiency and supporting freight movement.

Interstate 5 Bridge Replacement Program:

This \$2 billion award will replace the I-5 bridge over the Columbia River connecting Vancouver, WA, and Portland, OR, resulting in a more resilient structure that addresses seismic risks, corrects structural weaknesses, and reduces congestion.

Big Quilcene River Bridge Replacement Project:

This \$25 million award will replace the Big Quilcene River bridge on Linger Longer Road, adding pedestrian infrastructure and eliminating flood-prone road segments to improve safety and resilience.



As of January 2025,
\$11.9 billion
has been distributed across Washington from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, funding
1,578 projects.
