WISCONSIN INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Blatnik Bridge:

This \$1 billion award will replace the Blatnik Bridge between Superior, Wisconsin, and Duluth, Minnesota, resulting in increased bridge capacity and a new shared-use path for cyclists and pedestrians to easily access both states.

Milwaukee Lead Pipe Replacement:

This \$213 million award will help Wisconsin accelerate progress towards replacing every toxic lead pipe and delivering clean water. This includes \$30 million awarded to Milwaukee for lead pipe replacement.

I-39/90/94 Wisconsin River Bridge Replacement:

This \$80 million award will replace the existing Wisconsin River Bridge with two new spans carrying traffic in opposite directions, resulting in improved safety and traffic flow in Columbia County.
