WYOMING INFRASTRUCTURE FACTS



IIJA Funded Projects

Bighorn Divide & Wyoming Railroad:

This \$2 million award will improve rail infrastructure and safety in Wyoming, resulting in more reliable and secure freight operations.

Owl Creek Irrigation District:

This \$2 million award will improve drought resilience by making water use more efficient under the Department of the Interior's WaterSMART program, resulting in better water management for the area.

Lincoln County Electric Vehicle Planning:

This \$1.7 million award will fund planning work to integrate electric vehicles on local roads, resulting in improved infrastructure readiness for EV adoption.



As of January 2025,
